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# Ambulance Service - Step-by-step guide to driver training

## Stage 1 - Medical examination

An LGV medical examination will be arranged with our doctor at a time suitable for you. If satisfied you are medically suitable to become an LGV Driver, the doctor will complete a D4 medical report form then a member of staff will assist you in completing an application for your LGV provisional licence. The medical and provisional application forms will be sent to the DVLA for processing and will take approximately three weeks to be returned to your home address. You'll be provided with login information for online theory test practice. This will give you access to study materials and mock examinations.

## Stage 2 - LGV theory test

Please inform us as soon as your licence has been returned, as the LGV theory test cannot be taken until your provisional licence is returned from the DVLA. We suggest that you use this time wisely to self-study. The LGV theory tests can be taken at many theory test centres throughout the country. The multiple-choice test consists of 100 questions, the pass mark is 85 and the test lasts for one hour and 15 minutes. The hazard perception test consists of 19 clips and the pass mark is 67 out of 100 and will last for 45 minutes.

## Stage 3 - Driver training

Driver training will be conducted on a 1:1 basis. Training will commence at either 8.00am - 12.00pm or 12.30pm - 4.30pm each day and the time of your driving test will be determined by the tests allocated to us by the DVSA. GTG are an approved DVSA Test Centre and your driver training will cover the areas used by the DVSA to conduct the driving test.

## Stage 4 - Get your LGV licence

If you pass all stages successfully, the examiner will offer to send your licence to DVLA to have the full entitlement updated. If you are unsuccessful in passing your driving test this occasion, please contact your account manager to discuss the options available to you.

\*Some of your training may be completed on a 1:1 basis in a shorter time period due to social distancing measures, this will be discussed further at the time of booking.
