Step-by-step guide to training

After an initial enquiry has been made, you will have discussed how to fund the course and the options available to you.

Stage 1 - Medical examination

An LGV medical examination will be arranged with our doctor at a time suitable for you. If satisfied you are medically suitable to become an LGV Driver, the doctor will complete a D4 medical report form then a member of staff will assist you in completing an application for your LGV provisional licence. The medical and provisional application forms will be sent to the DVLA for processing and will take approximately three weeks to be returned to your home address. You'll be provided with login information for online theory test practice.

This will give you access to study materials and mock examinations.

Stage 2 - LGV theory test

Please inform us as soon as your licence has been returned, as the LGV theory test cannot be taken until your provisional licence is returned from the DVLA. We suggest that you use this time wisely to self-study. The LGV theory tests can be taken at many theory test centres throughout the country. The multiple-choice test consists of 100 questions, the pass mark is 85 and the test lasts for one hour and 15 minutes. The hazard perception test consists of 19 clips and the pass mark is 67 out of 100 and will last for 45 minutes.

Stage 3 - Driver CPC case study test

If you do not have C1 entitlement already on your licence gained through either sitting a test or gaining your car licence prior to 1997, you must gain the Driver CPC initial qualification which comprises two modules - Module 2 and Module 4. The Driver CPC Module 2 case study test can also be taken at many theory test centres throughout the country. Each test is made up of seven case studies, each one with six to eight questions, with a possible maximum score of 50 (of which the pass mark will be 38). The case study theory test must be completed prior to the initial CPC practical test.

Stage 4 - Driving assessment

The driving assessment will enable our instructors to assess your current driving ability and recommend the length of training course you require to reach DVSA test standard. You will be debriefed at the end of your drive. The assessment can be arranged as soon as you receive your provisional licence from DVLA either prior to theory tests or thereafter.

Stage 5 - Choose your course

Depending on the level of training you need, your dedicated Account Manager will discuss your assessment with you and give you advice on available course dates and costs.

Stage 6 - Driver training

Driver training will be conducted on a 1:1 basis. Training will commence at either 8.00am - 12.00pm or 12.30pm - 4.30pm each day and the time of your driving test will be determined by the tests allocated to us by the DVSA. Your driver training will be delivered using new, modern vehicles that will prepare you for working in the transport industry and will cover the DVSA learning to drive syllabus. All 3 GTG Training Centres are also DVSA Testing Centres.

Stage 7 - Driver CPC practical test

The Driver CPC Module 4 (driver walkround) is the second part of the Driver CPC, which you need to complete if you require the Driver CPC initial qualification. This test requires a demonstration of your knowledge and ability in the following areas:

- Ability to load the vehicle with due regard for safety rules and proper vehicle use.
- Ability to prevent criminality and trafficking in illegal immigrants.
- Security of the vehicle and contents.
- Ability to assess emergency situations.

Ideally, this will be completed during your training course.

Stage 8 - Get your LGV licence

If you pass all stages successfully, the examiner will offer to send your licence to DVLA to have the full entitlement updated. Your Initial Driver CPC Card will be issued after passing all 4 tests.

If you are unsuccessful in passing your driving test on this occasion, please contact your account manager to discuss the options available to you. If you are planning to upgrade from the LGV Category C licence to the LGV Category C+E licence, only Stages 4-6 apply.

(Please note: The LGV Category C licence must be gained prior to the LGV Category C+E licence.)
