# Emotet Security Alert



## Be alert

We've detected a new phishing scam, claiming that a global virus named 'Emotet' can infect all user devices such as laptops, smartphones and tablets.



## Challenge

Does the email look suspicious? Do you know the sender? Has the email caught you off guard? Remember, criminals will try to rush or panic you. Challenge suspicious emails and use good judgement.



## Protect
